This is an appeal from an order of the district court revoking appellant's probation. Second Judicial District Court, Washoe County; Deborah A. Agosti, Judge. Appellant Jose Contreras was convicted, pursuant to a guilty plea, of failure to change registered address as a sex offender. Contreras was sentenced to a prison term of 12-32 months. The sentence was suspended and Contreras was placed on probation for 12 months.

Contreras was alleged to not have maintained proper residency by moving four times, drinking alcohol, smoking marijuana and failing to obtain a substance abuse evaluation, in violation of the terms of his probation. After considering the evidence and arguments from counsel, the district court revoked Contreras' probation. The decision to revoke probation is within the broad discretion of the district court, and will not be disturbed absent a clear showing of abuse.¹

Contreras failed to abide by the terms of his probation. Contreras does not dispute that he failed to abide by the terms of his probation, rather he contends revocation is not appropriate. Evidence

supporting a decision to revoke probation must merely be sufficient to reasonably satisfy the district court that the conduct of the probationer was not as good as required by the conditions of probation.² Contreras does not dispute he did violate the conditions of his probation, therefore, we

ORDER the judgment of the district court AFFIRMED.
