

## ORDER DENYING PETITION FOR EXTRAORDINARY RELIEF

This is an original proper person petition for extraordinary relief, entitled "complaint for denial of constitutional rights, negligence and libel, slander, abuse of power, conspiracy, discrimination, false arrest and imprisonment." In this document, petitioner asks that this court grant judgment against the respondent in an amount not less than ten million dollars. Petitioner also asks that he be granted costs, attorney fees, and interest on the judgment. We note that this court lacks original jurisdiction over suits for monetary damages, and thus we lack the jurisdiction to provide petitioner the relief he requests. If petitioner
