ORDER DENYING PETITION FOR WRITS OF MANDAMUS AND PROHIBITION

This original petition for writs of mandamus and prohibition challenges a district court order denying petitioners' motion to strike a peremptory challenge.

A writ of mandamus is available to compel the performance of an act that the law requires, or to control an arbitrary or capricious

exercise of discretion.¹ The counterpart to mandamus, a writ of prohibition is available to arrest the proceedings of a district court exercising its judicial functions, when such proceedings are in excess of its jurisdiction.² Writ petitions are addressed to the sound discretion of this court.³ Further, such writs may issue only when there is no plain, speedy, and adequate remedy at law.⁴

We have considered this petition, and we are not satisfied that this court's intervention by way of extraordinary relief is warranted. Accordingly, we deny the petition.⁵

It is so ORDERED.
