ORDER GRANTING PETITION FOR RESIGNATION

This is a joint petition by the State Bar of Nevada and attorney Barbara Byrne for her resignation from the Nevada bar. Byrne states that she is aware that her resignation is irrevocable.<sup>1</sup>

Bar counsel has recommended that the resignation be approved, and the Board of Governors has accepted the petition for resignation. The petition includes statements from state bar staff confirming that no disciplinary matters, fee disputes, or client security fund matters are pending against Byrne, and that she is current on all membership fee payments and other financial commitments relating to her practice of law in this state.

SCR 98(5)(a) provides that inactive Nevada attorneys may resign from the state bar if certain conditions are met:

Any member of the state bar who is not actively engaged in the practice of law in this state, upon written application on a form approved by the state bar, may resign from membership in the

state bar if the member: (1) has no discipline, fee dispute arbitration, or clients' security fund matters pending and (2) is current on all membership fee payments and other financial commitments relating to the member's practice of law in Nevada. Such resignation shall become effective when filed with the state bar, accepted by the board of governors, and approved by the supreme court.

The petition satisfies the requirements of SCR 98(5). Accordingly, we grant the petition and approve attorney Barbara Byrne's resignation.

It is so ORDERED.
