ORDER OF REINSTATEMENT

On March 25, 1999, this court entered an order suspending attorney Gary Keith Salomons from the practice of law for one year from June 23, 1998. On June 29, 1999, Salomons filed a petition for reinstatement. In accordance with SCR 116(3), the Southern Nevada Disciplinary Board of the State Bar of Nevada conducted a hearing on the petition. The board determined that Salomons had met his burden of proof pursuant to SCR 116(3) and therefore recommends that Salomons be reinstated to the practice of law, on certain conditions: (1) that Salomons is to continue to provide Nevada bar counsel with copies of the quarterly reports to California bar counsel, until his California bar probation expires; (2) that Salomons is under an affirmative duty to notify Nevada bar counsel of any violation of his California bar probation; and (3) that Salomons is under an affirmative duty to notify Nevada bar counsel of any violation of his criminal probation.

Having reviewed the record of the reinstatement proceedings and the documents submitted in support of the petition, we conclude that clear and convincing evidence supports the board's findings and recommendations. We further conclude that Salomons' resumption of the practice of law will not be detrimental to the integrity and standing of the bar, to

the administration of justice, or to the public interest. See
SCR 116(3). Accordingly, we approve the recommendation of the
board, and we reinstate Salomons to the practice of law in this
state upon the conditions stated above.

It is so ORDERED.
