ORDER OF REFERRAL TO DISCIPLINARY BOARD

Bar counsel for the State of Nevada has filed a petition pursuant to the reporting requirements of SCR 111(4). The petition is supported by copies¹ of documents evincing that on December 21, 2009, in the Utah County Justice Court, Provo, Utah, attorney Gary L. Guymon, Nevada Bar number 3726, entered a no contest plea to one count of criminal trespass, a misdemeanor pursuant to Utah Code Ann. § 76-6-206 (2006), for which he was fined \$595. Guymon timely self-reported his conviction to bar counsel.

The crime to which Guymon pleaded no contest is not one of the crimes specifically enumerated in SCR 111(6) as mandating temporary suspension and referral to the disciplinary board. Accordingly, temporary suspension and/or referral to the disciplinary board are discretionary with this court. SCR 111(9).

¹ We note that the copies are not certified as required by SCR 111(4).

Although the crime Guymon stands convicted of may qualify as a "minor" offense under SCR 111(9), we are nevertheless concerned regarding the factual circumstances of the crime. We are further concerned about admissions made by Guymon in his answer and the exhibits thereto that may also reflect adversely on his fitness to practice law. Accordingly, we refer this matter to the appropriate panel of the state bar disciplinary board for determination of the discipline, if any, to impose. However, we decline to impose a temporary suspension at this time.

It is so ORDERED.²
