## ORDER OF AFFIRMANCE

This is an appeal from a judgment of conviction, pursuant to a guilty plea, of false imprisonment. First Judicial District Court, Carson City; Deborah A. Agosti, Senior Judge.

Appellant Joseph Guadalupe Lopez contends that the district court erred by failing to award him additional credit for time served in presentence confinement. We disagree. A defendant is entitled to credit for presentence confinement "unless [his] confinement was pursuant to a judgment of conviction for another offense." NRS 176.055(1); McMichael v. State, 94 Nev. 184, 194, 577 P.2d 398, 404 (1978) ("Only incarceration pursuant to a charge for which sentence is ultimately imposed can be credited against that sentence."), overruled on other grounds by Meador v. State, 101 Nev. 765, 711 P.2d 852 (1985), disapproved of by <u>Talancon v.</u> State, 102 Nev. 294, 721 P.2d 764 (1986), and abrogated on other grounds by Braunstein v. State, 118 Nev. 68, 40 P.3d 413 (2002). Here, the district court denied Lopez's request for additional credit at the sentencing hearing, stating that it would be an abuse of discretion to grant him credit in the instant case for time served while incarcerated pursuant to a misdemeanor domestic battery conviction. We agree and conclude that the district court did not abuse its discretion by denying Lopez's request. See
