



*ORDER DENYING PETITION*


This original petition for a writ of mandamus appears to challenge a district court order that denied a petition for a writ of habeas corpus in which Richard Antonio Williams challenged the computation of time he has served. We have considered the petition and conclude Williams has failed to demonstrate our intervention by way of extraordinary writ is warranted. *See Pan v. Eighth Judicial Dist. Court*, 120 Nev. 222, 228, 88 P.3d 840, 844 (2004) ("Petitioner[ ] carr[ies] the burden of demonstrating that extraordinary relief is warranted."). Specifically, Williams has a plain, speedy, and adequate remedy available to him because he can appeal from the district court order denying his petition.<sup>1</sup> *See* NRS 34.170; NRS


