ORDER DENYING PETITION

This original petition for a writ of prohibition or mandamus challenges the validity of respondent State Engineer's Order No. 1329.

Having considered the petition and its supporting documents, we are not persuaded that our discretionary and extraordinary intervention is warranted. Smith v. Eighth Judicial Dist.
