ORDER OF AFFIRMANCE

This is a proper person appeal from a final judgment in an action for insurance bad faith and related claims concerning the valuation of and damages to appellant's 1972 Mercedes. Having reviewed the record, we conclude that the district court's findings are not clearly erroneous and are supported by substantial evidence.<sup>1</sup>

First, the record supports the district court's finding that appellant's vehicle was not worth more than she has received in settlement from respondent and from the tortfeasor's insurer. Under the terms of the policy, appellant may receive the lesser of the vehicle's preaccident value or repair costs. Appellant is not entitled to any further amounts.

Second, the record also supports the district court's finding that respondent was not notified of the arbitration in time to intervene and participate. The rule announced in <u>Allstate Insurance Co. v. Pietrosh<sup>2</sup></u> applies only if the insurer has seasonable notice of the litigation and still

SUPREME COURT OF NEVADA fails to intervene. Here, respondent had only eleven days' notice of the arbitration, even though appellant had commenced the litigation several months earlier. Respondent is thus not bound by the arbitration award.

Third, the record reflects continuous efforts by respondent's employees to settle and conclude the matter. No evidence of bad faith is present. Therefore, the district court properly found that appellant's bad faith claim failed.

Finally, the record contains no evidence indicating that the district court's award of \$500 for the damage to appellant's car while in respondent's custody is inadequate.

Accordingly, we

ORDER the judgment of the district court AFFIRMED.
