ORDER OF DISBARMENT BY CONSENT

The Chair of the Southern Nevada Disciplinary Board has submitted, under SCR 112, a petition for attorney Patricia McAllister Brame's disbarment by consent. The petition is supported by Brame's affidavit, stating that she freely and voluntarily consents to disbarment, after consulting with counsel. Brame acknowledges in the affidavit that the grievance against her currently under investigation by the state bar sets forth violations of SCR 165 (safekeeping property) and SCR 203(3) (misconduct involving dishonesty, fraud, deceit or misrepresentation). Brame further concedes that the material facts in the grievance are true.

SCR 112 provides that an attorney who is the subject of a proceeding involving allegations of misconduct may consent to disbarment by delivering an affidavit to the appropriate disciplinary board, which must file it with this court. Brame's affidavit meets the requirements of SCR 112(1), and we conclude that the petition should be granted.

Accordingly, Brame is disbarred. Brame may not petition for reinstatement under SCR 116 until she has made full restitution to her former employer and to her former clients. The provisions of SCR 115 governing notice and publication of orders of disbarment shall apply to this order.
